Northwest Connections is Eau Claire County's contracted provider for emergency mental health & alcohol/drug services. Northwest Connections will provide callers with a risk assessment, intervention and safety planning targeting an individual's needs, apply the least restrictive treatment approach, and utilize the continuum of resources available within the community. 211 Great Rivers

Great Rivers 2-1-1 is a confidential community information, referral, and crisis line service that is available 24 hours a day. Great Rivers 2-1-1 staff are trained to provide supportive listening and emotional encouragement to individuals struggling with the stress and anxiety of these uncertain times. These services are available not only to those overwhelmed about the COVID-19 pandemic, but to all individuals experiencing difficulty. Great Rivers 2-1-1 staff connect individuals experiencing more elevated mental health crises to appropriate services when this is needed. Great Rivers 2-1-1 maintains a resource database of community programs and agencies that may be able to assist with helping callers meet basic needs or address other financial concerns.
